


When exploring the beach, you may find things and wonder what they came from. Sometimes it can even be hard to tell whether they are from a plant, animal or if they are man-made!

See if you can match up the pictures with the name of the object below.




The skeleton of a **sea urchin** is known as a **test**.

A **cuttlebone** is the internal skeleton of a cuttlefish or cuttle.

The tentacles of a **bluebottle** can sting you, even when out of the water.

Fibre balls come from a seagrass called *Posidonia* or strapweed.



The spiral **egg case** from a **Port Jackson shark** is sometimes referred to as a 'mermaid's purse'.

Sponges are simple animals with no mouth, internal organs or nerves.

The **ram's horn shell** is the spiral skeleton of a squid-like animal.
